**5. GENERAL BUSINESS**

**5.1. Work in Progress Report**

All Council members are expected to read this.

**5.2. Election of BRC Executive for 2011/2012**

We have 10 roles on the Council to fill and only received 4 nominations. The election will be held at this meeting! Please encourage anyone interested in taking on a role to attend the meeting.

**5.3. Election of Observers to the December 2010 NRC meeting**

Depending on the outcome of the election the Council may be required to elect observers to the NRC. We will accept nominations from the floor.

**5.4. Search for State Commissioner (Rovers)**

Jonathan Seller (acting RA to Oatley Bay Rovers) the only individual to submit an Expression of Interest has withdrawn his application. Unfortunately Jonathan felt he could not meet the time commitment required of the role.

The Council must now re open the search for a new State Commissioner (Rovers). Since Jeff Rose will be stepping down from the role in December the Council will need to find an individual to mind the role while the search continues.

Craig Starling, Assistant Region Commissioner (Rovers), has indicated he would be willing to mind the role until the April AGM of the Council.

**MOTION:** The Council invite Craig Starling to act as an advisor to the Branch Rover Council until the role of the State Commissioner (Rovers) is filled or until April 2011 Annual General Meeting of the Branch Rover Council.

#### **5.5. Governor General's Special Children's Christmas Party**

Communication regarding this event has previously been circulated. Delegates will be required to inform the Council how many Rovers from each region will be participating in the event.

If there are a sufficient number of Rovers attending the Council will be required to purchase face-painting equipment to accommodate approximately 800 children.

**MOTION:** The Council resolves to release funds to cover the cost of face-painting equipment not exceeding a combined total value of \$200.

#### **5.6. NSW Rovers Handbook**

The NSW Rover Handbook publication is a compilation of procedures, practices and guidelines designed to govern the Rover section in New South Wales. It has been designed as a "single source of truth" - a centralized and comprehensive reference of NSW Rover documentation and resources.

A draft copy of the NSW Rovers Handbook will be circulated at or prior to the November BRC meeting.

**MOTION:** The Council: 1) adopt the NSW Rovers Handbook as an official publication of the Council 2) commits to maintaining the publication over time 3) adopt the NSW Rovers Handbook as the official source of Rover section procedures, practices and guidelines.

#### **5.7. BRC Constitution Review Committee**

4 lawyers and a Senior Lecturer from the Newcastle Business School are currently reviewing the draft rewrite of the NSW Branch Rover Council constitution.

The draft of the rewritten Branch Rover Council constitution will be circulated at or prior to the November BRC meeting for consideration by the Council members.

The rewrite makes almost no changes to the Councils structure and operation. The focus of the rewrite was to remove duplication, contradictory statements, and inappropriate information. It was also designed to clarify our structure and operation while still retaining flexibility. The one significant change the rewrite introduces is the idea that members of the Executive will no longer be able to act as delegates while in office.

**MOTION (for voting at the February 2011 meeting):** The Council adopts the amendments to the BRC constitution.

#### **5.8. NRC Agenda Item: Rover Service Award**

The Rover Service Award (known in NSW as the Stan Bales Rover Service Award) is an Adult Service Award that can be awarded by the Branch Rover Council on the recommendation of a Crew, Region Rover Council, or the Branch Rover Council itself to Rovers, Rover Advisors, other uniformed of the Scout Movement, and/or non-uniformed people, who give outstanding service to the Rover Section.

The Award is currently a cloth emblem/badge with a red and white knot on a blue background that may be worn by Rovers on their uniform. It is the only Adult Service Award, excluding the Certificate of Merit, that does not also have a medallion (designed to be worn around the neck e.g. Silver Kanagaroo) associated with the award.

NSW would like to take a discussion paper to the December 2010 NRC meeting proposing the development of a medallion for the Rover Service Award. A sample design will be developed in time for the NRC meeting.

**MOTION:** The Council supports the proposal for the development of a medallion for the Rover Service Award.
